Main Replacements

Service reliability is always a priority for Veolia and mains have been replaced in numerous communities in recent years, including Alpine, Bergenfield, Cliffside Park, Englewood, Fort Lee, Lambertville, Paramus, Ridgefield Park, Teaneck, Toms River, Union City, Vernon and Weehawken.

Wastewater Plant Upgrades

A \$56 million project to replace the Princeton Meadows Wastewater Plant in Plainsboro will ensure reliable service and compliance with current and future environmental standards. Treated water from the facility is used to irrigate a nearby golf course, one of Veolia's many sustainability efforts across the state.



Water Quality Improvements

Veolia's proactive approach to exceptional water quality is demonstrated at the eight PFAS treatment systems the company has built in New Jersey. As PFAS emerged as a concern nationwide, the company instituted a rigorous testing program and began installing treatment systems to remove the substances.

Lead Removal

Veolia has invested \$169 million in recent years to remove more than 12,000 lead service lines in 60 municipalities. We're not stopping until all the lead is removed. Every day, more than a dozen crews are in the field pulling lead from the ground.
